Academic Integrity

Students enrolled at The Michener Institute will be held to a high standard of academic integrity in all areas of conduct. Individual students must assume responsibility for the measure of discipline and academic integrity appropriate to their role as students in a health care profession.

Academic Integrity is a commitment, even in the face of adversity, to five fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, and responsibility. From these values flow principles of behavior that enable academic communities to translate ideals into action.

Acts such as plagiarism, impersonation and cheating are considered a direct violation of academic integrity and will result in severe penalties.

Attendance

Attendance in all laboratory, simulation and clinical sessions is mandatory. Course outlines will identify any other specific attendance requirements in the grading information.

Failure to attend scheduled laboratory, simulation and clinical sessions, except where supported with documentation of unavoidable cause, can result in a loss of marks, the awarding of a failing grade for a course, up to and including permanent withdrawal from the program. Permanent withdrawal may occur at any point during the academic session.

Please note: For OSAP approved programs students are required to attend all scheduled classes and placements. A student who is in receipt of funding from the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP), who has not attended twenty eight (28) consecutive days of scheduled classes, is deemed withdrawn from the program for OSAP purposes and is reported to the Ministry with student's last day of full-time attendance. Such absence will affect student's eligibility for OSAP assistance.
